Hello Q.U.I.L.T.S. members! I'm Connie Trigger and I've assisted long time member Mary Wade with Programs for the past several years. I've "graduated" to the Programs chairperson position and have been joined by two very capable, experienced quilters, Barb Valachovic and Kathy Lenic. They have been great resources as we've worked on researching and vetting potential teachers.

In the Programs Committee survey last spring we asked you for feedback on whether you prefer workshops in person or on Zoom, workshops on Fridays or Saturdays and project based or skill based workshops. You were split almost exactly 50/50 on all three questions! So, again this year we are balancing Fridays with Saturdays, in-person with Zoom and project based with skill based topics. We've also taken into consideration additional feedback on workshop topics, teacher suggestions, space concerns and other ideas. For instance, several of you suggested having members of the guild teach workshops – we've got one! Laura Swensen, and room for potentially two more. This year we have scheduled at least two stand alone workshops for months where there are sew-ins or parties during our guild meetings. Do you have anything you'd like to teach us in September or February? Contact me!

In other odds and ends, due to the increase in costs for using our current space, we have been looking at alternate workshop venues. 2024 - 2025 is the final year for using your one time \$20.00 workshop credit. We are partnering with local quilt shop and guild supporter Dianne's Quilted Square who will be offering discounts on some workshop supplies.

Our goal is to have most of the year's registration materials ready for our September meeting so you can plan your participation. And speaking of participation, we need yours! Our small committee has been making calls, writing emails and scouring websites and lists of potential quilters to stitch together an enjoyable, varied slate of educational offerings. Be the ... binding? © Regardless of your skill level or experience, our goal is to help you feel comfortable, welcome and prepared for our workshops.

Straight From The Heart Quilts For Kids

As discussed at the June meeting, we will be donating quilts created by our members to Northern Rivers, Things of My Very Own and Child Advocacy Center of Schenectady. Since the groups service children of all ages, at our September meeting, everyone will receive a handout with the parameters for the various groups. These parameters are necessary in order to make the most of the backing fabric and batting we have on hand.

This year, I would like to form "teams" of people who will help in the creation of kits, cutting fabric, backings and batting. We will also be looking to create groups of people willing to quilt and bind the quilts. This finishing step is often where we get bogged down and end up with several tops in our queue.

Finally, we will be accepting fabric beginning in September. Nothing smaller than a fat quarter will be accepted unless it is already cut into either 5" or 6.5" square. Remember, our quilts are meant to bring joy and comfort to children living in less-than-ideal situation. Choose fabrics, colors and patterns that align with our purpose. If you are planning on donating fabric, please arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the beginning of the meeting. See either Christina or myself for your donation. Thanks in advance.

General Guidelines for Veterans Quilts

Size: 50" x 74" or 45" x 60" size may vary.

Fabric & Design: 100% cotton fabric. Colors and patterns are your choice and do NOT have to be red/white/blue or patriotic. Recipients are mostly men and many prefer to choose non-patriotic quilts.

Label: Please place a label on the back of the quilt with your name (Mary Smith or Mary S.), Schenectady Q.U.I.L.T.S. and a brief thank you. It can be handwritten in permanent fabric pen, inkjet-printed, or embroidered. It is meant to identify the origin of the quilt and often we will receive a thank you note from the recipient. We also attach a star and a note from the guild to each quilt.

Ready-to-assemble kits are provided at each meeting. A kit includes fabric for the top, backing, and binding as well as a pattern and batting. Quilts may be machine quilted or tied (every 4"). If tying the quilt, please make sure the ties go all the way through all 3 layers and are tightly knotted.

Before handing in your finished quilt, please be sure all pins/needles have been removed and the binding and label are securely attached.

Friendship groups may want to make a quilt(s) as a project.

Stay tuned for an announcement of our first veterans quilt sew-in. Thank you for your continued support of our Veterans Quilts project.
