Q.U.I.L.T.S. Membership

The guild welcomes new members! Anyone wishing to join the guild, membership dues are \$30 for the 2024-2025 guild-year, which runs July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025. Membership can be initiated or renewed by visiting the membership desk at any monthly guild meeting. Hello quilters!

Our 2024 – 2025 workshop series got underway in November when 14 of us met at the Fort Hunter Fire Department's community room to learn how to use Stripology rulers from Q.U.I.L.T.S. member Laura Swensen. We cut strips, played with color and made "Strip Joint" blocks with this very helpful tool.

We've got a good variety of workshops still to come, having kept in mind your feedback in the Spring 2024 Programs survey. At our guild meetings dozens of members are adding their names to the "Save a spot for me!" workshop sheets at the Programs table. It's not an obligation to register, or a guarantee of a spot, but is an opportunity to receive registration links first.



Our December workshop (on the 6th, 9:30 – 4:30) will be with Maryjean Vligorsky of Westerloo, NY. We will be creating cozy, ~30" x ~40" rugs out of jelly rolls. We've moved the location to Brink

As we "Zoom" into January, Brita Nelson of Berwyn, Pennsylvania, will join us at our virtual guild meeting on the 2nd to share her lecture, "Now You See It, Now You Don't. The Magic of Disappearing Blocks." Then also via Zoom on Saturday, January 4th, she will hold the workshop,

"Making Magic, a Disappearing Block Sampler Quilt." We will learn nine different disappearing 9-patch blocks to assemble into a sampler quilt and receive a handout with 20 additional

rectangle that we'll piece and quilt before class. A quilter and former art teacher, Cookie will provide guidance ahead of time as to dimensions of the rectangle as it will relate to the length and width of the jacket and amount of bias binding to be prepped before class. Charity Donation

Our guild has a tradition of collecting gifts for a charity at our December meeting each year. This year we will be supporting the two organizations that receive Straight From The Heart Kids' Quilts made by our members, Things Of My Very Own (https://thingsofmyveryown.org/) and Schenectady County Child Advocacy Center (https://schenectadycountyny.gov/districtattorney/cac).

Things Of My Very Own does not get a lot of book donations. They requested new books for children ages newborn to age 7, ranging from board books to early chapter books.

The Schenectady County Child Advocacy Center would like bags. They do not get funding for bags to use when sending children home with food, gift cards, clothing, etc. I spoke with Casey, the director, and she suggested string backpacks. You can find inexpensive options to purchase but they are easy to make and will be convenient for the center to store. If you Google "string backpack tutorial" you will find tons of videos. Keep it simple! The string backpacks do not need pockets or a lining.

Veterans Quilts

Thank you to all who continue to make Veterans Quilts. We will be making a delivery to the Stratton VA Hospital and the Fisher House in November. If anyone is interested in going with us to hand out quilts, please let me know. It is truly a heartwarming experience.

For anyone who may not know, the guild provides Veterans quilt kits (free) at each guild meeting to guild members who would like to take one to make. Kits include fabric for making the quilt top, backing, and binding as well as batting and a fabric label. Alternatively, you can use your own pattern and fabric. Guidelines are below. We can provide a 60" x 80" batting. There is a brief history of this service project on our website https://quiltschenectady.org/?page_id=53 if you would like more information.

General Guidelines for Veterans Quilts

Size: Approximately 50" x 70".

Fabric & Design: 100% cotton fabric. Colors and patterns are your choice. However, most recipients are men and they don't often choose the patriotic ones. Please take this into consideration when making your selections.

Label: Please place a label on the back of the quilt with your name, Schenectady Q.U.I.L.T.S. and a brief thank you. Example: "Thank you for your service. Made by Mary Smith, Q.U.I.L.T.Schenectady, November 2024". It is a means to identify the origin of the quilt and often we will receive a thank you note from the recipient. We also attach a note from the guild to each quilt.

Join us for Quilting @ the Rotterdam Community Center

A new quilting group, the Wednesday Quilters, has been started at the Rotterdam Community Center, 705 Curry Road, every Wednesday from 1:00-4:00 pm. Whether you're an experienced quilter, an intermediate who wants to expand your skills, or you're just starting out, come sew with us!

We meet in the Friendship Hall which is on the 2nd floor. There is an elevator to help transport heavy items. Tables, chairs, an ironing board, iron, cutting mats, rotary cutters, and acrylic rulers are available for all to use. Participants may work on any sewing project, by machine or hand, that they wish. There is no obligation to attend every week or to stay the entire 3 hours. Best of all, there is no fee to attend!

In keeping with the mission of the RCC, this is supportive learning environment where more experienced quilters share their knowledge, tips, and techniques with less experienced quilters. We offer a Learn to Quilt component where beginners can learn to make a quilt before investing a lot in fabric, tools, and notions. They only need to have a

working sewing machine and have a basic understanding of how to sew on it.

Through a partnership with the Q.U.I.L.T.Schenectady quilt guild, Veterans Quilt kits are



available for beginners. Experienced quilters in the group help teach the beginner quilter how to make the quilt, and provide ongoing support through all phases of the quilt making process. Once the quilt is completed, the quilt is returned to the guild to be donated to the VA Hospital or the Fisher House.
